## JANUARY 11, 2026 \* BAPTISM OF THE LORD

### The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

commemorates Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist in the Jordan River, marking the end of the Christmas season and the start of His public ministry, celebrated on the Sunday after Epiphany (usually January 12 or 13). It reveals Jesus' divine identity (God's beloved Son), manifests the Trinity, and invites believers to reflect on their own baptism, renewing their promises and connecting to Christ's mission.

#### Key Aspects of the Feast:

**Significance:** Jesus' baptism, though He was sinless, showed His solidarity with humanity and His mission to save, sanctifying the waters for all.

**Liturgical Timing:** It concludes the Christmas cycle and ushers in Ordinary Time, occurring on the first Sunday after Epiphany (Jan 6).

**Theophany:** In the East, it's called Theophany, meaning "manifestation of God," as the Father's voice and the Spirit (as a dove) appeared.

**Connection to Our Faith:** The day prompts Catholics to remember their own baptism, a call to holiness, and to live by Christ's light.

#### How to Celebrate:

Renew your baptismal promises.

Light your baptism candle.

Bless your home with holy water.

The Baptism of the Lord reminds us of Jesus' mission and God's saving plan. It shows us how Jesus was chosen and sent to bring light and salvation to all people.

- **Jesus as God's Servant:** Jesus is revealed as the chosen servant, sent to bring justice and peace. The first reading shows God's delight in His servant who brings hope to the nations.
- **The Anointing of Jesus:** Jesus is anointed by the Holy Spirit to carry out His mission. The second reading highlights how God anointed Jesus with the Holy Spirit and power to heal and bring peace.
- **The Call to Humility:** Jesus' baptism shows His humility as He steps into the water with sinners. The Gospel shows Jesus identifying with those He came to save.
- **The Role of the Holy Spirit:** The Spirit comes upon Jesus to strengthen Him for His mission. The Gospel reminds us that the Holy Spirit plays an important role in Jesus' work.
- **The Father's Love and Approval:** God the Father declares His love for His Son. This moment shows Jesus as the beloved Son, fulfilling His mission with the Father's approval.
- **Light for All People:** Jesus is sent to open the eyes of the blind and free the oppressed. The first reading points to His mission to bring light to those in darkness.

The Baptism of the Lord teaches us about Jesus' mission and our call to follow Him. It reminds us of the Father's love, the power of the Holy Spirit, and the hope Jesus brings to all.

**BEREAVEMENT MINISTRY** is to provide spiritual, emotional, and practical support to grieving families and individuals within the parish community, offering comfort, guidance, and a tangible expression of Christ's love during times of loss. Key activities include helping plan funeral liturgies, offering prayers, providing meals or receptions, sending remembrance cards, and organizing grief support groups and resources to accompany the bereaved through their mourning process and to celebrate the hope of eternal life.

### Spiritual and Emotional Support:

**Consolation and Prayer:** Ministers offer comfort and prayer, both privately and within the community, embodying the Church's call to "comfort all who mourn".

**Faith Formation:** The ministry helps to explain the Catholic faith, including the meaning of funeral rituals and the hope of the resurrection, providing a deeper spiritual context to the grieving process.

**Grief Support Groups:** Many parishes offer support groups, helping individuals navigate their grief in a safe, faith-filled environment.

### Practical Support:

**Funeral Liturgy Planning:** Ministers guide families through the process of planning the funeral Mass, assisting with the selection of readings, music, and other details.

**Wake and Funeral Services:** Volunteers may serve as greeters, lectors, or Eucharistic Ministers at funeral liturgies and can help with preparations for these services.

**Funeral Receptions and Meals:** Some ministries organize or assist with funeral luncheons or receptions, providing a space for fellowship and support for bereaved families.

**Follow-up and Resources:** Ministry members often send follow-up cards, offer grief literature, and maintain contact with families, especially during holidays and on the anniversary of the death.
