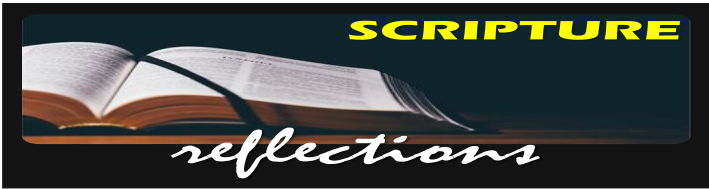

The 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time focuses on God's patience, mercy, and the growth of His kingdom. The readings show how God gives people time to change and how His kingdom grows in unexpected ways.

- **God's Justice and Mercy:** God is strong but also kind. He gives people time to turn back to Him instead of punishing them right away.
- **Patience in Growth:** The parable of the wheat and weeds teaches that good and bad exist together for now. God waits until the right time to separate them.
- **Power of Small Beginnings:** The mustard seed and yeast show that God's kingdom starts small but grows. What seems unimportant can have a big impact.
- **The Spirit's Help in Prayer:** The Holy Spirit helps when people do not know what to say in prayer. God understands even when words fail.
- **Hope for Repentance:** God does not rush to punish but gives people chances to change. He wants them to turn back to Him.
- **Trust in God's Timing:** The farmer in the parable waits for the right time to gather the harvest. God knows the right time to act in the world and in people's lives.

The readings remind people that God is patient and merciful. He gives time for growth and change, and His kingdom will grow in ways they may not expect.

The registration fee will be \$25 per child, with family rates available.

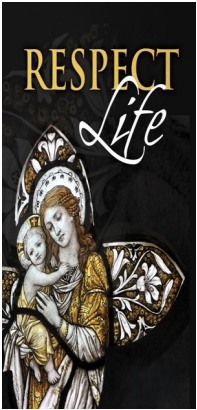

ST. MARY MAGDALENE is one of the greatest saints of the Bible and a legendary example of God's mercy and grace. The precise dates of her birth and death are unknown, but we do know she was present with Christ during his public ministry, death and resurrection. She is mentioned at least a dozen times in the Gospels. Mary Magdalene has long been regarded as a prostitute or sexually immoral in western Christianity, but this is not supported in the scriptures. It is believed she was a Jewish woman who lived among Gentiles, living as they did. The Gospels agree that Mary was originally a great sinner. Jesus cast seven demons out of her when he met her. After this, she told several women she associated with and these women also became followers. There is also debate over if Mary Magdalene is the same unnamed woman, a sinner, who weeps and washes Jesus' feet with her hair in the Gospel of John. Scholars are skeptical this is the same person. Despite the scholarly dispute over her background, what she did in her subsequent life, after meeting Jesus, is much more significant. She was certainly a sinner whom Jesus saved, giving us an example of how no person is beyond the saving grace of God. During Jesus' ministry, it is believed that Mary Magdalene followed him, part of a semi-permanent entourage who served Jesus and his Disciples. Mary likely watched the crucifixion from a distance along with the other women who followed Christ during His ministry. Mary was present when Christ rose from the dead, visiting his tomb to anoint his body only to find the stone rolled away and Christ, very much alive, sitting at the place they laid Him. She was the first witness to His resurrection. After the death of Christ, a legend states that she remained among the early Christians. After fourteen years, she was allegedly put into a boat by Jews, along with several other saints of the early Church, and set adrift without sails or oars. The boat landed in southern France, where she spent the remaining years of her life living in solitude, in a cave. St. Mary Magdalene's feast day is July 22. She is the patroness of converts, repentant sinners, sexual temptation, pharmacists, tanners and women, and many other places and causes.
