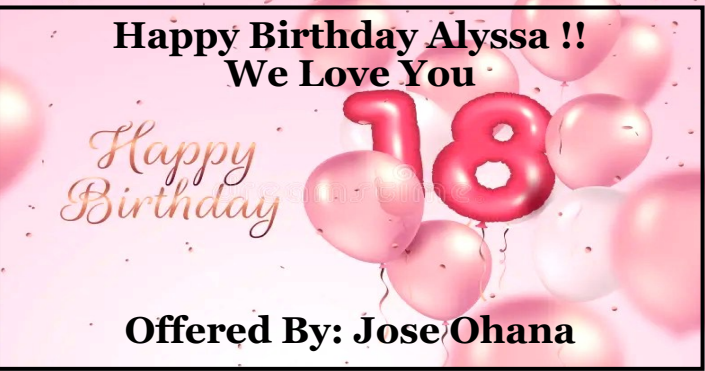

- The readings this weekend show God's authority and wisdom. They also highlight the role of Peter and the Church in carrying out God's plan.
- **God's Authority Over Leaders:** God removes She-bna and gives authority to Eliakim. This shows that God chooses leaders and can take away their power.
 - **Christ as the Foundation:** Jesus tells Peter that He will build His Church on him. This shows that the Church is established by Christ and will last.
 - **Faith and Recognition of Jesus:** Peter calls Jesus the Son of God. His faith allows him to see the truth about Jesus.
 - **Wisdom of God:** Paul reminds us that God's wisdom is beyond human understanding. No one can fully know God's ways.
 - **Keys of the Kingdom:** Jesus gives Peter the keys to heaven. This shows that the Church has authority to guide people to God.
 - * **Glory Belongs to God:** Everything comes from God and exists for Him. All honor should go to Him.

The readings remind us that God is in control. He gives authority and wisdom to those who trust in Him.

**A Prayer After the Storm (Catholic Rural Life)
Deacon Dan Freeman's prayer reflects gratitude,

QUEENSHIP OF MARY

SCRIPTURAL AND THEOLOGICAL FOUNDATIONS

Mary's Queenship is deeply rooted in both the Old and New Testaments:

The Davidic Kingdom: In ancient Israel, the king's mother (the *Gebirah*) held the position of great influence and honor. This role of the "Queen Mother" points to Mary's place in the Kingdom of God.

The Annunciation: At the Annunciation, the angel Gabriel announced that Mary's Son would receive the throne of David and rule forever.

Book of Revelation: In Revelation 12, John writes of a "woman clothed with the sun" who has a "crown of twelve stars" on her head. Christian tradition interprets this woman both as the Church and as Mary, crowned as Queen of Heaven.

HISTORY OF THE FEAST DAY

Pope Pius XII established this feast in 1954 through his encyclical *Ad Coeli Reginam* (To the Queen of Heaven).

The Connection to the Assumption: The feast was created as a logical continuation of the dogma of the Assumption. It is celebrated on the octave (eighth day) of the Solemnity of the Assumption.

Date Change: Originally, Pope Pius XII set the feast for May 31. However, during the liturgical reforms of 1969, Pope Paul VI moved it to August 22 to emphasize the inseparable link between Mary's bodily Assumption and her coronation in heavenly glory.

MARY'S REIGN

Catholic theology emphasizes that Mary's queenship is not about political dominion or power, but rather about intercession, charity, and spiritual motherhood. Because Jesus shares his kingship with all creation, Mary's role is one of service, acting as an advocate and loving intercessor for humanity from her throne in heaven.

OBSERVANCE AND THE ROSARY

The Queenship of Mary is the focus of the final **Glorious Mystery of the Holy Rosary**—The Coronation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The faithful often use this day as an opportunity to reflect on Mary's exalted role in the history of salvation and to ask for her protection and intercession.



On this 21st Sunday of Ordinary Time, we give thanks for the gift of life from conception to natural death & human dignity and pray for expectant parents, those with pregnancy difficulties, expectant parents & post abortion healing. These events respect life:

- 1) 40/365 Days For Life,
- 2) Sidewalk Advocates Training, (TBA),
- 3) Hawaii State Laws, prayers,
- 4) Walking With Moms In Need programs, prayers,
- 5) End to human trafficking, prayers
- 6) Elderly, end to assisted suicide.
