The readings this Sunday focus on faith, service, and the role of Jesus in our lives. They show how the early Church grew, how believers are called to be living stones, and how Jesus is the way to the Father.

- **Faith in Jesus:** Jesus tells His disciples to trust in Him. He shows them that He is the way to God, and faith in Him leads to eternal life.
- **Serving Others:** The first reading shows the apostles choosing helpers to care for those in need. The Church must serve others and make sure no one is forgotten.
- **Jesus as the Cornerstone:** The second reading calls Jesus the cornerstone of God's house. Those who follow Him become part of this spiritual building.
- **God's Chosen People:** Believers are called a holy people in the second reading. They are chosen to share God's light with the world.
- **Following the Way:** Jesus says He is the way, the truth, and the life. He leads people to the Father, and no one can go to God except through Him.
- **Works of Faith:** Jesus says His followers will do great works in His name. Faith leads to action, and believers must continue His mission on earth.

Jesus calls His followers to trust in Him, serve others, and live as God's chosen people. The Church must continue His mission with faith and love.

YOUNG ADULT MINISTRY (YAM) provides faith-based community, discipleship, and service opportunities for adults typically aged 18-39, bridging the gap between youth and older adult ministries by addressing unique needs like career, relationships, and independent faith exploration through Bible studies, social events, and mission work, aiming to build authentic connections and spiritual growth. It often serves college students, young professionals, military personnel, and young families, offering a supportive environment distinct from traditional youth groups, focusing on deeper faith formation and practical life application.

Key Aspects of Young Adult Ministry

Target Audience: Broad age range (e.g., 18-39), including college students, working professionals, singles, married couples, and those with or without children.

Purpose: To foster authentic community, spiritual growth, leadership, and service, helping young adults navigate life's challenges with faith.

Activities: Bible studies, worship nights, social gatherings, service projects, mentorship, and leadership training.

Focus: Moving beyond youth-focused activities to address the specific needs of young adults, providing a space for them to be heard, valued, and nurtured.

How to Grow a Young Adult Ministry

Gather a Core Team: Involve young adults in planning to understand their needs.

Create Welcoming Environments: Offer comfortable, non-threatening spaces for fellowship.

Offer Diverse Programming: Include worship, study, social events, and service.

Develop Leaders: Empower young adults to lead different aspects of the ministry.

Connect Faith & Life: Show how faith applies to careers, relationships, and daily living.
