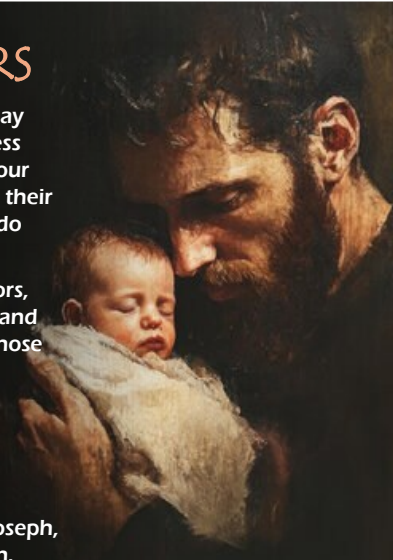
A PRAYER FOR ALL FATHERS

The readings for the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time remind us to trust in God, even when we face challenges. They show that God is with us, gives us strength, and offers us grace through Jesus.

- **Trust in God's Protection:** Jeremiah faced danger for speaking God's truth, but he trusted that God would protect him. Jesus tells His followers not to be afraid because God watches over them.
- **Courage in Faith:** Jeremiah and Jesus both talk about standing firm in faith, even when others oppose us. God calls us to be brave and trust that He will take care of us.
- **God's Mercy and Kindness:** The psalm reminds us that God listens to those who suffer. Even in hard times, we can call on Him and trust in His love.
- **Sin and Grace:** Adam's sin brought suffering, but Jesus brings new life. Because of Jesus, we can receive grace and forgiveness.
- **Fear of God, Not People:** Jesus tells His followers not to fear those who can harm the body. Instead, they should respect and follow God, who has power over both body and soul.
- **God Knows and Cares:** Jesus reminds His followers that God knows even when a small bird falls. If God cares for the smallest creatures, He surely cares for each of us.

The Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time teaches us to trust in God's care, even when we are afraid. He is with us, giving us strength and guiding us in faith.

THE NATIVITY OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

is a high-ranking Catholic feast celebrated annually on **June 24**. It honors the miraculous birth of Jesus' cousin and forerunner, who prepared the way for the Messiah.

This feast holds a deeply unique place in the Catholic liturgical calendar, characterized by specific traditions and theological significance:

Why His Birthday is Celebrated

Traditionally, the Catholic Church only celebrates the earthly birthdays (or "nativities") of three individuals: **Jesus Christ** (Christmas, Dec. 25), the **Blessed Virgin Mary** (Sept. 8), and **St. John the Baptist**. Because John was sanctified in his mother's (St. Elizabeth's) womb, he was freed from Original Sin before his birth. This allows the Church to rejoice in his birth just as it does for the Lord and the Mother of God.

Theological Significance

John the Baptist serves as the bridge between the Old and New Testaments. His mission was to prepare humanity for the coming of Christ.

The Timing: The feast is strategically celebrated exactly six months before Christmas. This timing ties into the summer solstice, reflecting the symbolism of John's own words about Jesus: "*He must increase, but I must decrease.*" Following June 24, the days begin to grow shorter (daylight decreases), while after December 25, the days begin to grow longer (the light of Christ increases).

Two Feast Days: John is one of the only saints with two liturgical feast days: his **Nativity** (June 24) and his **Martyrdom** (August 29).

Traditional Catholic Customs

Because of its proximity to midsummer, the feast has historically been celebrated with festive, time-honored traditions:

St. John's Fires: Lighting bonfires on the eve of the feast to symbolize John's role as a "burning and shining lamp" and to mark the peak of summer.

Herbs and Blessings: In some European cultures, people gather "St. John's herbs" (like St. John's Wort) and bring them to church to receive a special blessing.

For scriptural background on the miraculous birth of John to the elderly Zechariah and Elizabeth, you can read the full account in the Gospel of Luke (Luke 1:5-25).

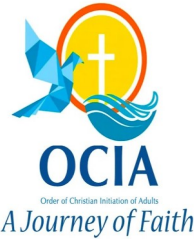
