ALTAR SERVERS are lay assistants who help a priest or deacon during Christian liturgical services, such as Mass. Their primary role is to perform tasks at the altar to ensure the liturgy runs smoothly, including carrying liturgical books and candles, ringing the altar bell, and assisting with the preparation of the gifts. By performing these duties and actively participating in the service, they serve as an example of reverence for the congregation.

Duties of an altar server

Processional duties: Carrying the cross and processional candles.

Altar preparation: Assisting with the preparation of the altar, including setting out the gifts of bread and wine.

Assisting the priest: Holding the liturgical books for the priest and assisting with tasks like washing the priest's hands.

Liturgy support: Ringing the altar bell during the consecration and handling the incense and censer.

Active participation: Responding to prayers, joining in hymns, and maintaining appropriate postures (sitting, standing, kneeling) to show reverence and a prayerful attitude.

Significance of the role

Service: Altar servers are considered servants of God and the church community, with their actions serving as a form of prayer.

Participation: They are a way for the laity to participate in a more intimate and active way during the celebration of the Mass.

Example: Their focused and reverent demeanor serves as a positive example for the congregation

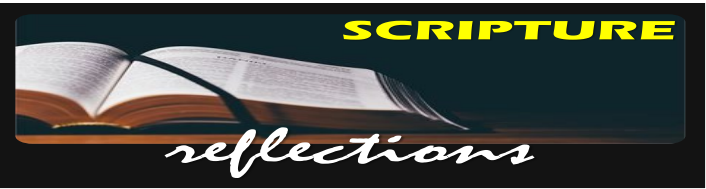

The Solemnity of Christ the King reminds us that Jesus is our true King. His kingdom is different from earthly kingdoms because it is built on love, mercy, and sacrifice.

- **Jesus as King:** Jesus is not a king who rules with power and force. He leads with love, humility, and service.
- **God’s Kingdom is Eternal:** Earthly rulers come and go, but Jesus’ kingdom will never end. His rule is one of peace and justice.
- **Salvation Through Jesus:** The second reading reminds us that Jesus rescues us from sin. He brings us into his kingdom and makes us part of his family.
- **Mercy and Forgiveness:** Jesus forgives the criminal on the cross. His kingdom is open to all who turn to him with faith.
- **Humility and Suffering:** Jesus does not save himself from the cross. His suffering shows that true kingship is about sacrifice, not power.
- **Faith in Jesus:** The good thief believed in Jesus even when others mocked him. His faith brought him the promise of eternal life.

The Solemnity of Christ the King Year reminds us that Jesus is a different kind of king. He rules with love, mercy, and justice, and his kingdom will never end.

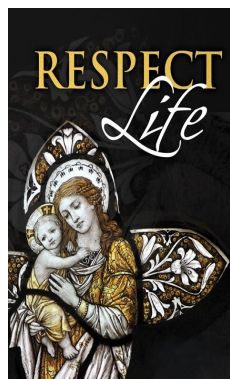

CONFIRMATION / FIRST COMMUNION * NOVEMBER 15, 2025





THE FEAST OF THE KINGSHIP OF CHRIST

is a celebration of Jesus Christ's authority and reign over all creation, observed on the last Sunday of the liturgical year. Established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 to counter rising secularism, it reminds believers to acknowledge Christ's kingship publicly and privately and not give their ultimate allegiance to any earthly ruler. Celebrations often include a feast and focus on living a life guided by Christ's teachings, emphasizing kindness and truth.

Key aspects of the feast

Meaning:

The feast celebrates Christ as the divine "King of Kings" and "Lord of Lords," whose rule is eternal and over all creation, including governments and societies.

Origin:

It was instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI to address the growing secularism and political turmoil of the time. The goal was to remind Christians of Christ's supreme authority, particularly in the face of rising totalitarian regimes.

Timing:

The feast is celebrated on the last Sunday of the liturgical year, which is also the final Sunday of Ordinary Time. This places it just before the start of Advent.

Observance:

It is primarily a Catholic feast, but it is also observed by some other denominations, such as the Anglican Church.

Spiritual significance:

The feast is a call for Christians to live out their faith fully by making Christ the king of their own lives. This is done through actions like speaking the truth, being kind to others, and following Jesus's teachings.
