




SPECIAL INTENTION: AI & Susette Eremita



The readings for this Sunday talk about healing, faith, and gratitude. They show how people respond to God's help and how faith brings wholeness.

- Healing comes from God: Naaman is healed of leprosy after following God's instruction. Jesus heals ten lepers, showing that God brings both physical and spiritual heal-
- Faith leads to healing: Naaman at first doubts but then obeys and is healed. The Samaritan leper trusts Jesus, returns to give thanks, and is told his faith has saved him.
- Gratitude is important: Naaman returns to thank Elisha after being healed. Only one of the ten lepers thanks Jesus, showing that many forget to be grateful.
- God's mercy is for all: Naaman is not an Israelite, but God still heals him. The one grateful leper is a Samaritan, showing that God's love is for everyone.
- Hardship and faith: Paul suffers for preaching about Jesus, but he stays faithful. He reminds others that suffering for Christ leads to glory with him.
- Jesus is always faithful: Paul says that even when people fail, Jesus remains true. Jesus héals even those who do not return to thank him.

This Sunday's readings teach about faith and gratitude. They remind people to trust in God and to give thanks for

PARISH FINANCE COUNCIL

PARISH FINANCE COUNCIL serves as a consultative and advisory body to the pastor, providing expert advice on the stewardship of parish financial affairs and assets. Its primary roles include assisting with budget preparation and review, creating annual financial reports for the diocese and parishioners, and ensuring compliance with diocesan financial policies. While the council offers advice and assistance, the pastor maintains ultimate legal responsibility for financial decisions, acting within the framework of Canon Law and diocesan policies.

Key Responsibilities

Financial Stewardship: To provide advice and expertise on the parish's financial matters, including the management of funds, banking arrangements, and long-range financial planning.

Budgeting and Reporting: To assist the pastor in preparing the annual parish budget of income and expenditures and to help prepare the annual financial report for review by the diocesan finance committee and for dissemination to parishioners.

Internal Controls: To ensure that proper internal controls are in place and to review them periodically, typically at least twice a year.

Asset Management: To assist in developing an inventory of the parish's movable and immovable goods and to offer advice on their stewardship.

Policy Compliance: To assure the implementation of all diocesan policies and procedures related to financial matters.

Extraordinary Administration: To provide an opinion on more significant financial business, specifically matters that go beyond the pastor's approved level of ordinary administration.

Authority and Accountability

Consultative Role: The council is a consultative, not a decision-making, body. It provides advice to the pastor.

Pastor's Responsibility: The pastor or administrator remains ultimately responsible for all financial decisions.


Diocesan Policies: The council's actions are subject to the laws of the universal Church and all diocesan policies and procedures.

Accountability: The council is accountable to the pastor, who has the final authority.

Composition and Appointment

Expertise: Members are chosen for their appropriate expertise, particularly in business and financial matters.

Appointment: Members are appointed by the pastor, sometimes with recommendations from the parish pastoral council
