

The Third Sunday in Lent

The readings for this Sunday help us understand that we must follow God's commandments and truly live them in our hearts to find life. The first reading gives us the ten commandments. The second reading reminds us that God's wisdom is not like human wisdom. And the gospel tells of Jesus cleansing the temple of the money changers who put there own desires above serving the Father.

- The reverence for the temple: The temple was a sacred space for the Jewish people, and it was meant to be a place of worship and prayer. Jesus' actions demonstrate the importance of maintaining the sanctity of the temple and not allowing it to become a marketplace. The importance of worshiping and serving God alone is also emphasized in the first reading for the 3rd Sunday of Lent Year B. In both cases, there is a focus on the centrality of God in our worship and church practices.
- **The zeal for God's house:** Jesus' zeal for God's house is evident in his actions in the temple. As believers, we are called to have a similar zeal for God's house and to prioritize our relationship with God above all else.
- **The purity of heart:** Jesus' cleansing of the temple is also a symbol of the purification of the heart. As believers, we are called to strive for purity of heart, which means being mindful of our thoughts, words, and actions, and ensuring that they are aligned with God's will.
- The significance of the Eucharist: The temple in Jerusalem was a foreshadowing of the true temple, which is the body of Christ. As Catholics, we believe that Jesus is present in the Eucharist, and that every time we participate in Mass, we are entering into the presence of God. The Gospel reading reminds us of the significance of the Eucharist and the importance of approaching it with reverence and awe. This also ties in with the first reading, which reminds us to keep the Sabbath holy.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults

On the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent, we participate in the Scrutinies (Lenten rites for our Elect: **Keola Kalawa** and **Grace-Ann Kaai**) at the 9:30am masses. At these masses, we will use the Lectionary's "Scrutiny Readings" from Cycle A.

The Scrutinies are among the most ancient prayers in the Christian liturgical tradition. As early as the second century, Christian communities would help those who had been chosen for Baptism to prepare for their invitation by laying on of hands and by praying for protection and deliverance from evil.

The Universal Church hears the stories of the Samaritan woman, the Man born blind, and the raising of Lazarus. These readings were chosen to be the driving force of prayerful introspection, surrender, and conversion . They offer powerful images for all of us of need, surrender, sin, conversion, faith and healing. In our faith journey with those seeking Baptism, we must stir our souls, as if they were dying campfires, to expose any pieces of ourselves that have not been purified by the burning love of the Holy Spirit. (*The Association for Catechumenal Ministry, 2007*).

Please continue to pray for our Elect that together we may discover (like the woman in the well) the living water of our redeemer, **Jesus the Christ!**


