Third Sunday of Advent

This Weekend's Readings

First Reading
Is 61:1-2A,10-11

Second Reading 2 Thes 5:16-24

Gospel Jn 1:6-8,19-28

The readings for the Third Sunday in Advent (Gaudete Sunday) encourage us to rejoice because our salvation is near. The first reading foreshadows the coming of the Messiah, the anointed one. The psalm is the Magnificat - "My soul rejoices in my God." The second reading encourages us to rejoice, pray, and give thanks. And in the gospel John the Baptist tells the priests that he is not the Christ, but that the Messiah is coming.

- Witness to the Light: John the Baptist's role as a witness to the light, who is Jesus, is emphasized. This theme highlights the importance of testifying to Jesus as the true Light who brings divine truth and life.
- Identity and Mission of John the Baptist: John's clear denial of being the Christ, Elijah, or the Prophet reflects his understanding of his own identity and mission. This theme illustrates the importance of knowing one's role in God's plan and staying true to it.
- **Humility in Service**: John's declaration of unworthiness to untie Jesus' sandals showcases his humility. It teaches that true greatness in God's kingdom comes from recognizing one's own humbleness and the superiority of Jesus.
- **Preparation for the Messiah:** John's role in preparing the way for Jesus underscores the theme of making oneself ready for the Messiah's coming. It calls for spiritual readiness and openness to receive Christ.

Question:

Why is rose used during Advent in the Advent wreath and vestments?

Advent is a time of penance, and so the ordinary liturgical color for Advent is violet. On the third Sunday of Advent, which is also called *Gaudete* (Latin: "Rejoice") Sunday, we recognize the joyful anticipation of the season that will culminate in the birth of Christ on Christmas by changing the liturgical color to rose. Rose is a "brightening" of the ordinary violet and thus symbolizes joy.
