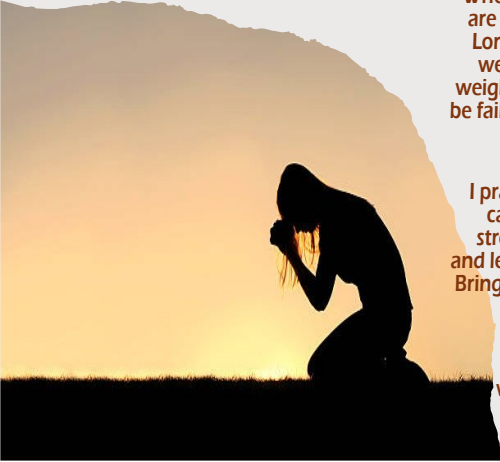

The readings this weekend teach about sacrifice, suffering, and following God's ways. They show that being faithful is not always easy, but it is worth it.

- God's call is strong:** Jeremiah feels overwhelmed by God's message, but he cannot keep it inside. Even when people mock him, he must speak the truth.
- True worship requires sacrifice:** Paul urges believers to offer themselves to God. This means living in a way that pleases God, not following what the world values.
- Suffering is part of faith:** Jesus tells His disciples that He must suffer and die. This shows that following God's plan often brings hardship, but it leads to life.
- God's ways are not human ways:** Peter wants to protect Jesus from suffering, but Jesus corrects him. Human thinking often focuses on comfort, but God's plan is bigger.
- Carrying the cross:** Jesus calls His followers to deny themselves and take up their crosses. Faith is not just about belief; it requires action and sacrifice.
- The soul is worth more than the world:** Jesus warns that gaining everything means nothing if a person loses their soul. Faith is about seeking what lasts forever, not just what feels good now.
- God will judge each person:** Jesus says that the Son of Man will come and repay people for their deeds. Faith is not just about words but about how a person lives.

This weekend we are challenged as believers to think differently. Following Jesus means sacrifice, but it leads to true life.

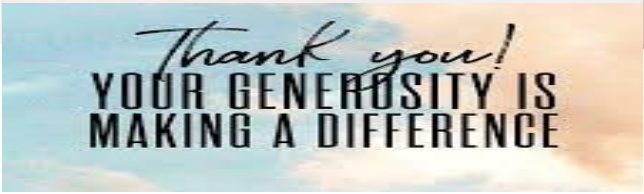

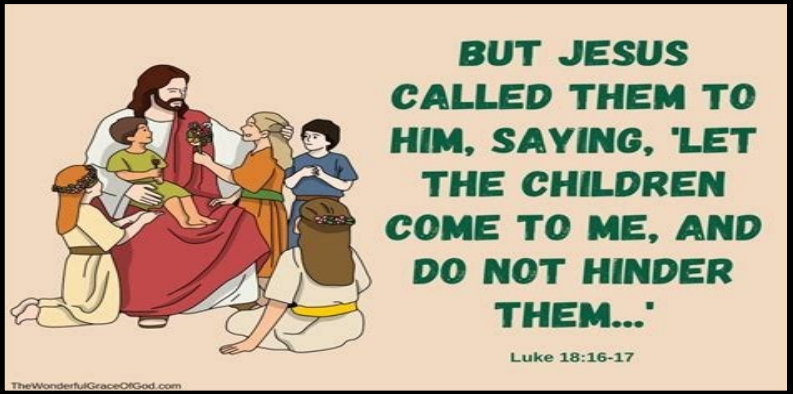

**FAITH FORMATION
Matthew 19:14**





THE CHURCH FATHERS are influential theologians, bishops, and scholars from the early Christian centuries (c. 100–750 AD) whose writings and leadership defined and defended Catholic doctrines. They are recognized for their orthodoxy, sanctity, and proximity to the Apostles, often split into Greek (Eastern) and Latin (Western) traditions.

KEY CHARACTERISTICS

To be considered a Church Father, the Church requires four major characteristics:

- Antiquity:** Lived before the 8th century (ending roughly with St. John of Damascus in 749).
- Doctrinal Orthodoxy:** Taught sound doctrine in agreement with the Church.
- Personal Sanctity:** Lived holy lives.
- Church Approval:** Recognized by the Church for their contributions.

MAJOR CHURCH FATHERS

- Apostolic Fathers (1st-2nd Century):** Direct disciples of the Apostles. Key figures include **St. Clement of Rome** (Pope), **St. Ignatius of Antioch**, and **St. Polycarp of Smyrna**.
- Greek Fathers (Eastern):** Often focused on theological development of the Trinity. Key figures include **St. Athanasius of Alexandria** (defended against Arianism), **St. Basil the Great**, **St. Gregory of Nazianzus**, and **St. John Chrysostom**.
- Latin Fathers (Western):** Often focused on theology, ecclesiology, and grace. Key figures include **St. Ambrose of Milan**, **St. Augustine of Hippo** (author of *Confessions*), **St. Jerome** (translated the Vulgate), and **Pope St. Gregory the Great**.
- Other Notable Fathers:** **St. Irenaeus of Lyons** (early defender against heresy) and **St. Cyril of Alexandria**.

SIGNIFICANCE TO CATHOLICISM

The Church Fathers are seen as key pillars of Catholic tradition, aiding in the development of doctrines regarding the Eucharist, the Papacy, the Trinity, and the Blessed Virgin Mary.
