MAY 31, 2026 * HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY



TRINITY SUNDAY (officially the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity) is celebrated on the first Sunday after Pentecost to honor the mystery of one God in three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It is a major feast in the Western Church, highlighting the central dogma of Christian faith.

Key Facts About Trinity Sunday:

Significance: While Christians baptize and pray in the name of the Trinity daily, this day is specifically set aside to contemplate the divine nature of God as a communion of love.

Origin: Pope John XXII ordered the feast for the entire Church in 1316-1334. It was established as a formal, annual celebration of the doctrine that emerged to counter heresies like Arianism, which questioned the divinity of Christ.

Liturgical Focus: The Mass readings emphasize the unity of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It marks a transition in the liturgical calendar from the intense focus on Christ's life to a contemplation of the nature of God.

Distinction: Unlike other feasts that celebrate an event (like Christmas) or a saint, Trinity Sunday commemorates a doctrine.

Devotion and Tradition:

Prayers: Catholics often recite the Gloria Patri ("Glory be to the Father..."), the Athanasian Creed, or specific prayers praising the triune God, such as "O Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, I adore Thee profoundly".

Symbolism: It encourages a focus on the triune God at the heart of the Christian life, stemming from baptism into that name.

The feast serves as an invitation to deepen faith in the profound mystery that surpasses human understanding, centering on God's internal life as love.

- **God's Loving Nature:** God shows us love through His actions. He is always ready to forgive and shows kindness to all.
- **God's Justice and Mercy:** While God is loving and forgiving, He also brings justice. He helps us understand that mercy and justice work together.
- **Peace and Unity:** Paul encourages the people to live in peace. Unity among believers is important to God, and He calls us to be united.
- **Blessing Through Christ:** Through Jesus, God offers grace to everyone. We are blessed with His love and friendship through the Holy Spirit.
- **Gift of Eternal Life:** God sent His Son to give us the gift of eternal life. Those who believe in Jesus can be saved from death and live forever.
- **The Role of the Holy Spirit:** The Holy Spirit brings us closer to God. He helps us grow in faith and guides us in living out God's will.
- **Faith and Salvation:** Belief in Jesus is key to salvation. Without faith, we miss the chance to receive the gift of eternal life.

Ordinary Time in the Catholic Church, is the longest liturgical season, making up 33 to 34 weeks of the year. It occurs outside the major seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The name comes from "ordinal" numbers, meaning the weeks are counted sequentially (e.g., *the 10th Sunday in Ordinary Time*).

THE TWO SEGMENTS

Ordinary Time is split into two distinct periods, focusing on the public ministry and teachings of Jesus:

First Segment: Begins the day after the Baptism of the Lord (*in January*) and continues until the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday.

Second Segment: The longer stretch that begins on the Monday after Pentecost and concludes right before the First Sunday of Advent

LITURGICAL COLOR AND SYMBOLISM

Green: The liturgical color worn by priests during this season. Green is a symbol of life, growth, hope, and anticipation.

Liturgical Cycles: The Sunday Scripture readings rotate on a three-year cycle (*Year A, B, and C*). The daily Mass readings rotate on a two-year cycle (*Year I and II*).

THE SPIRITUAL MEANING OF THE SEASON

Despite the name "ordinary," there is nothing mundane about the season. Rather than focusing on a specific, high-intensity mystery of Christ's life (such as his birth or resurrection), the faithful use this time to reflect on Jesus' everyday teachings, miracles, and the application of Gospel values to daily life. It serves as a period for:

- * Consistent, ongoing discipleship.
- * Spiritual growth and ordering daily life to Christ.
- * The celebration of various saints and feasts (*like the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity and Corpus Christi*).

CULMINATION

The season always concludes on the last Sunday of the liturgical year with the **Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe** (*also known as Christ the King*).


