The Fifth Sunday in Lent

The readings for this Sunday focus on God's covenant with us, even though we are often unfaithful. The first reading speaks of a new covenant. The second reading speaks of the obedience of Jesus Christ brought about our salvation. And in the gospel Jesus foretells his death and explains that those who follow him will find eternal life.

The Mass readings for this Sunday revolve around several interconnected themes that highlight the transformative nature of faith, the fulfillment of God's promises, and the path to eternal life through sacrifice and obedience. Here are the main themes:

- New Covenant and Inner Transformation: The first reading from Jeremiah speaks of a new covenant that God will establish with His people. Unlike the old covenant, which was external and often broken, this new covenant will be written on their hearts, symbolizing an intimate and unbreakable relationship with God. It emphasizes God's mercy and the transformative power of His law within us.
- Obedience Through Suffering: The second reading from Hebrews presents Jesus as the model of obedience and submission to God's will, even in the face of suffering. It highlights the idea that true obedience to God can involve hardship and pain but leads to greater wisdom and fulfillment of God's plan for salvation.
- Death and Resurrection: The Gospel according to John introduces the metaphor of a grain of wheat that must die to produce life, illustrating the necessary passage through death to reach the fullness of life. This theme is central to the Lenten journey, pointing towards Jesus' death and resurrection as the path to new life for all believers.
- Self-Denial and Service: Jesus' teachings on self-denial and the importance of serving others are key themes in the Gospel. He emphasizes that following Him requires a willingness to let go of personal desires and ambitions in favor of a life dedicated to serving God and others.
- Universal Salvation: Jesus' statement about drawing all people to Himself
 upon being lifted up from the earth speaks to the universal nature of His mission.
 His death and resurrection are not just for a select few but offer salvation to all
 who believe in Him, transcending cultural and religious boundaries.
- Divine Assurance and Human Response: The divine voice affirming Jesus'
 mission and the varied responses from the crowd illustrate the theme of faith and
 doubt. It highlights the challenges believers face in understanding and accepting
 the mysteries of faith, as well as the assurance that God's plan is being fulfilled
 through Jesus.

These themes for this Sunday guide the faithful towards a deeper understanding of God's love and salvation plan, encouraging a personal and communal transformation that aligns with the heart of the Lenten season.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults

At the Saturday 5:00pm Mass, we celebrate the Penitential Rite for our baptized candidate, **Michelle Gonzales**. She is preparing for the reception of Confirmation at Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. The moving and powerful prayers of this rite evoke the baptismal graces which this candidate has already received and asks for God's help for spiritual growth and healing.

At the Sunday, 9:30am Mass, we celebrate the Third Scrutiny Rite and Anointing of our Elect: **Keola Kalawa** and **Grace-Ann Kaai**. The Scrutinies invite the elect to do some self searching aimed at helping them progress in their awareness of sin and their desire for salvation. With the Gospel message as their foundation, the elect are encouraged to name areas of needed change and conversion that they have come to recognize through a deeper knowledge of and growing dependence upon Christ.

Our elect will also be anointed with the Oil of Catechumens. This anointing symbolizes their need for God's help and strength as they face the many obstacles and challenges of the Christian life.

Please also pray for our Baptized Candidates for Full Communion into the Catholic Church: **R.J. James**, **Paiailelagi Alaelua**, and **Seth Armodia**, that they may continue to grow in the grace and knowledge of our lord.
