The readings for the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time focus on God's word and how people receive it. They remind us that God's message is meant to bring life, but it requires open hearts to grow.

- **Power of God's Word:** God's word is like rain that nourishes the earth. It always fulfills its purpose, just as the first reading says.
- **Fertile Hearts and Faith:** The parable of the sower shows that people respond to God in different ways. A heart that is open and willing to listen will grow in faith.
- **Challenges to Faith:** Some people struggle to hold on to God's message. Distractions, worries, and hardships can keep faith from growing.
- **Hope in Future Glory:** The second reading reminds us that present struggles are small compared to the joy that will come. This hope helps believers stay strong.
- **God's Generosity in Creation:** The psalm describes the beauty and richness of the earth. It reflects how God provides and blesses those who trust in Him.
- **Call to Listen and Understand:** Jesus explains that not everyone truly listens to God's word. Understanding takes effort and a desire to grow.

God's word is always working, but people must be ready to receive it. This Sunday, we are called to trust, listen, and let faith take root.

The story of **OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL** (Feast day: July 16) originates with 12th-century hermits living on Israel's Mount Carmel. Inspired by the Old Testament prophet Elijah, they built a chapel and dedicated themselves to Mary, forming the Carmelite Order. It is a story of biblical history, deep devotion, and miraculous protection.

The Biblical Roots: Mount Carmel and Elijah

Mount Carmel—a striking coastal mountain range in present-day Israel—has been a historical site of prayer and spiritual reflection. According to the Bible (1 Kings 18), it was here that the prophet Elijah defeated the 450 prophets of the pagan god Baal in a contest of faith, calling down fire from heaven to prove the power of the one true God.

Later, during a severe drought, Elijah sent his servant to look toward the sea. After looking seven times, the servant spotted a "small cloud rising from the sea" (1 Kings 18:44), which quickly opened up into torrential, life-saving rain.

For centuries, Carmelite mystics have viewed this cloud as a symbolic prophecy of the Virgin Mary, who would bring forth Jesus—the ultimate source of spiritual grace.

The Founding of the Carmelites

In the late 12th century, a group of Christian hermits settled in the natural grottoes of this mountain. They sought to live a life of solitude and continuous prayer in emulation of Elijah. They constructed a chapel in the midst of their hermitages and dedicated it to the Blessed Virgin. Because of this, they became officially known as the **Brothers of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Mount Carmel**, revering her as the patroness and "Lady of the place".

The Vision of Saint Simon Stock and the Brown Scapular

In the 13th century, the Carmelites faced intense persecution and struggled to maintain their order. Tradition holds that on July 16, 1251, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to Saint Simon Stock, an English Carmelite Prior. During this vision, Mary presented him with the **Brown Scapular**. The scapular—originally a larger piece of cloth worn over the shoulders as an apron by religious orders—was offered as a "sign of her protection" and a pledge of her maternal care. According to Carmelite tradition, she promised that whoever dies wearing the scapular with devotion would be preserved from eternal damnation.
